



Digitizer's estimate of \$2,165 is for 50 of 54 documents. The smaller size of documents in this batch means they can use a smaller scanner that is cheaper to operate. 5 of the 50 documents require the larger scanner. The 4 documents still needing an estimate need to be examined in person due to their unstable condition. If they can be scanned, 3 of those 4 will require the larger scanner and likely cost \$800. Extra expenses will likely be added for preparing those documents for scanning. This cannot be known until they are in the custody of the digitizer.

My labor on the project is estimated to be 16 hours. I am only billing for 8. The complimentary hours are for presenting to the Board (1 hour) transporting the documents to/from the digitizer (2 hours), communicating with Jenna's office about the 4 remaining items and how to handle them (1 hour), and providing Jenna's office follow up support for any document-related questions or concerns that come after the project (4 hours).

The "One Big Beautiful Bill Act" permanently reinstated the pre-deductible telehealth safe harbor from the Cares Act. Details will be available at the Open Enrollment meetings.

Also, our Plan will increase the Flexible Spending Account (FSA) annual contribution limit from \$2,400 to \$3,000 and will be adding a debit card. The card will only allow for approved IRS eligible health care expenses.

The County has brought back Delta Dental of Iowa insurance with basically the same benefit levels we had with our previous Delta Dental coverage. The Board of Supervisors have approved increasing the orthodontic lifetime maximum from the current \$2,000 to a \$2,500 benefit, attempting to keep up with the Plan's participating providers allowed fee.

There are no rate changes to the Principal Vision and Voluntary Term Life rates.

Again, Principal is offering a re-opening for the Voluntary Term Life for up to 2 units each per employee, spouse, and child(ren) without completion of a statement of health. This includes all current and future first-time enrollees. Spouse and child(ren) life coverage amounts cannot exceed the employee coverage amount.

Iowa Interstate Railroad, LLC (IAIS), Iowa Department of Transportation (IDOT), and Jasper County (County) mutually agree to close and remove the railroad crossing located at or about the intersection of S 28th Ave W, Colfax, IA and IAIS's right-of-way. IDOT and County have entered into a Crossing Closure Incentive Agreement effective ______. This agreement outlines the responsibilities of both parties for the closure and is attached to and incorporated herein as Exhibit A.

The below outlines the responsibilities of IAIS regarding the closure of the crossing listed herein.

IAIS:

- 1. Remove crossing including roadway crossing surface, railroad cross bucks, and roadway approach surface to 25' from track centerline within six (6) months of signed acceptance of this letter.

- 3. Remit payment of \$15,000.00 to County.

IAIS and County mutually agree that any and all rights that County, or any of its successors, currently and previously held to the crossing listed herein will be terminated by the acceptance of this letter.

SECTION 1. Contracting Parties

This Agreement is between the State of Iowa acting by and through the Iowa Department of Transportation, hereafter called the STATE, and Jasper County, Iowa, hereafter called the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY.

IN CONSIDERATION OF the mutual promises contained herein the STATE and the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY agree as follows:

SECTION 2. Purpose of Agreement

The STATE and the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY enter into this Agreement for the purpose of an incentive payment for the permanent closure of the <u>South 28th Ave West</u> crossing of Iowa Interstate Railroad Company's tracks in Jasper County, Iowa.

The STATE agrees to secure funds under 23 USC Section 130 for the cost of the closure incentive payment if matched or exceeded by the Iowa Interstate Railroad. The STATE's sole purpose under this agreement is to administer the federal funds.

SECTION 3. HIGHWAY AUTHORITY Responsibility

The HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall close and maintain as closed the crossing of South 28th Ave West identified as U.S.DOT/FRA number 607896J, Milepost335.99, and shall thereafter install and maintain the appropriate warning signs and SI-182 permanent road closure barricades. Warning signs and barricades shall comply with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways (23 CFR 655F). The crossing closure shall be in accordance with 306.10 of the Code of Iowa. The HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall remove the roadway and its surface to its right of way line. The HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall provide the necessary documents to verify the permanent closure and street vacation.

SECTION 4. NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

The HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall notify the STATE's Contact Person no later than 14 days prior to the start of the closure project at the crossing. The HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall also notify the STATE's contact person when the permanent closure work including the installation of barricades at the project location is completed.

SECTION 5. Contact Persons

All notices required under this Agreement for this project shall be made to the respective Contact Persons listed on page 1 of this Agreement.

SECTION 6. Regulations Affecting this Agreement

Regulations of the Federal Highway Administration apply to the project for funds appropriated under Federal Highway legislation, subject to all applicable STATE laws, rules, and regulations. Specific reference is made to 23 USC Section 130, Iowa Code Section 306.10, and the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways (23 CFR 655F); and any supplements or revisions to the Manual issued by the Federal Highway Administration.

SECTION 7. Documentation of Railroad Incentive Payment

The HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall provide the necessary documents to verify the railroad owning the tracks on which the crossing is located has made an incentive payment to the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY for the permanent closure of the South 28th Ave West rail-highway crossing.

SECTION 8. Project Inspection

The STATE shall have the right to inspect the crossing closure work at any time. After the permanent closure has been completed the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall notify the STATE and provide the date of completion. The STATE will arrange an inspection with the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY so it can determine whether the crossing closure compiles with the terms of the Agreement. After the crossing closure has been completed and inspected, the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall deliver to the STATE a fully signed CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION AND FINAL ACCEPTANCE OF AGREEMENT WORK FOR THE CLOSURE. The signed certificate shall mean the crossing closure has been satisfactorily completed and no further work is required.

SECTION 9. Final Payment

The HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall be required to pay the initial closure costs. Upon completion of the crossing closure the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall submit a final bill to the STATE for the eligible amount of incentive payment. The amount of the incentive payment payable to the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY for the crossing closure shall not exceed the lesser of (1) \$\frac{15,000}{0}\$ or (2) the amount of incentive payment paid to the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY by the railroad. The HIGHWAY AUTHORITY agrees to use the amount of the incentive payment for transportation safety improvements.

The STATE may audit the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY records to determine the eligible amount of incentive payment. The HIGHWAY AUTHORITY shall reimburse the STATE for any justifiable exceptions.

All payments to the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY under this Agreement are contingent upon Federal funding. If Federal funds are not made available, the STATE shall not be responsible for any incentive payments.

SECTION 10. Successors in Interest

This Agreement is binding upon all successors and assigns.

SECTION 11. No Prior Representation

This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the STATE and the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY concerning this crossing closure.

SECTION 12. Effective Date

This Agreement shall be effective upon the date of the STATE's execution.

SECTION 13. Termination Due to Lack of Funds

Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, and subject to the limitations set forth below, the STATE shall have the right to terminate this Agreement without penalty and without any advance notice as a result of any of the following: 1. The federal government, legislator or governor fail in the sole opinion of the STATE to appropriate funds sufficient to allow the STATE to either meet its obligations under this Agreement or to operate as required and to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement; or 2. If funds are de-appropriated, reduced, not allocated, or receipt of funds is delayed, or if any funds or revenues needed by the STATE to make any payment hereunder are insufficient or unavailable for any other reason as determined by the STATE in its sole discretion; or 3. If the STATE's authorization to conduct its business or engage in activities or operations related to the subject matter of this Agreement is withdrawn or materially altered or modified. The STATE shall provide the HIGHWAY AUTHORITY with written notice of termination pursuant to this section.

SECTION 14. Execution Clause

This Agreement may be executed and delivered in two or more counterparts, each of which so executed and delivered shall be deemed to be an original, and shall constitute but one and the same instrument. If any section, provision, or part of this Agreement shall be found to be invalid or unconstitutional, such judgment shall not affect the validity of any section, provision, or part thereof not found to be invalid or unconstitutional.
