




# **Healthy Lung Month**

# **Quitline Iowa**


Quitline Iowa is the free, confidential resource in Iowa for quitting tobacco and nicotine products. The service offers counseling over phone and online chat, as well as a variety of tailored programs. We know provider support is important in the quitting process, so our staff offer Ask, Advise, Refer trainings to providers to help facilitate cessation conversations with patients and clients.

This past quarter, staff provided trainings to two organizations in Marshalltown. They presented to providers in the McFarland Pediatrics department and at Wild Spirit Counseling. Thank you to these providers for inviting us and for helping their patients and clients quit tobacco and nicotine with Quitline lowa!






