ELIGIBILITY FOR SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS

Social Security benefits are there for you when you:

- Age and retire (62 or older & have paid social security taxes for 10+ years)
- Stop or limit work because of a disability or blindness (& enough work history)
- Lose a spouse (or a young child loses a parent)
- Have difficulty paying for essentials like food, clothing, and a home
 Answer a few questions to see if you qualify for benefits right now.



Veteran Career Planners

Veteran Career Planners (VCPs) are located in most IowaWORKS Centers across the state. VCPs work directly with eligible Veterans and other eligible persons by providing individualized career services to prepare for and secure suitable employment.

Such services include:

- Comprehensive assessments of skills levels
- Development of an Individual Employment Plan
- Development of job interviewing and resume writing skills
- Provision of individual career planning services
- Assistance with placing eligible Veterans in federally-funded employment and training programs
- Referrals to supportive services



For more than 50 years, AARP Foundation Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) has provided people over age 55 with opportunities to fill entry-level and mid-level positions with employers in their communities.

HOW IT WORKS

SCSEP trainees are placed in a variety of community service activities at nonprofit and public facilities like day care and senior centers, schools and hospitals. This on-the-job training experience can be a bridge to find employment opportunities outside of the program. Participants work an average of 20 hours a week and are paid the highest federal, state or local minimum wage.

WHO'S ELIGIBLE?

You must be age 55 or older, unemployed and financially qualified. Please contact your local office to learn more about the financial qualifications.

AARP Foundation SCSEP is funded by a \$46,889,529 grant from the U.S. Department of Labor. This funding provides 90% of the support for SCSEP, with AARP Foundation matching 10%.

OTHER BENEFITS

We provide participants with assessments, training and support services that are important for finding future employment. The services include:

- Individual Employment Plan (IEP) development
- Computer literacy and other specialized training to prepare for placements
- · Wages and fringe benefits
- Annual physicals
- Assistance in securing future employment

WHAT KINDS OF JOBS ARE AVAILABLE?

You could be placed in a wide variety of community service positions at both nonprofit and public facilities including day care and senior centers, governmental agencies, schools, hospitals and libraries. These training assignments help build the skills and experience needed to obtain future employment. Additional training through lectures, seminars, one-on-one instruction, training programs and community colleges may also be provided.
